ACTIVITY GUIDELINES

- 1) Stick the [Conservation Players Cards](#) around the room and ask the students to stand up.
- 2) When the teacher reads out a statement from the [People & Conservation Scenario Handout](#), students then move and stand next to the card in the room that denotes the people who are the biggest 'winners' in the scenario, followed by who are the greatest 'losers'.
- 3) If there are any differences of opinion these can be discussed and can lead to conversations about the idea of the frequent conflicts of interest in conservation work.

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CONSERVATION SCENARIOS

1. Fishing quotas are introduced to reduce amount of fish that can be caught.
2. A beach clean-up is organised by the local government.
3. Lobsters become very popular in restaurants on the Islands.
4. A wind farm is planned to be built on the slope of a volcano.
5. A new eco-lodge is built for ecotourism to develop.
6. The national park reserve space is increased for tortoise habitat restoration.
7. A rat poisoning scheme is set up to rid the Islands of the rodents.
8. A series of education programmes are delivered on the subject of energy conservation.
9. Part of the ocean is declared a 'no-go' zone to everyone.
10. A hotel is fined for not complying with new pollution laws.
